



Explains the provisions of the 1974 Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA). Enumerates ERISA requirements for plan participation, vesting, years of service, survivor benefits, and administrative requirements. Lists plan disclosure requirements and conditions for tax-qualified status. Describes how pension plans are funded, and explains sanctions for underfunding. Provides guidelines for required reporting to the Internal Revenue Service, including details of Form 5500, which . . .

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

LBSC 488 Recent Trends and Issues in Library and Information Services (1-3). Discussions of recent trends and issues in library and information services.

LBSC 499 Workshops, Clinics and Institutes (1-9). Workshops, clinics and institutes developed around specific topics or problems.

LBSC 600 Proseminar: The

(3). Background and orientation for
advanced study in library and
information services, including
communication, the use and
economics of information, libraries

LBSC 611 Archives and Libraries in Western Civilization (3). Survey of the development of archives, libraries and their materials and personnel from the earliest record to the present. Emphasis on the socio-economic forces controlling the development of these institutions and on their role in the formation and continuation of Western civilization.

LBSC 621 Library Service to the Disadvantaged (3). Problems of service to the disadvantaged (ethnic/racial minorities, handicapped, institutionalized and aged). Case studies on the creation of library programs and the resolution of problems of service. Includes field experience.

LBSC 630 Library Administration
(3). Administrative theory and principles and their implications and applications to managerial activity in libraries and other information organizations.

LBSC 632 Library Personnel

LBSC 643 Library Media Specialist in Educational Systems (3).

Educational context in which library media specialists function. Activities and roles of library media specialists within educational systems. Cognitive, affective, and social characteristics of client groups.

LBSC 645 Children's Literature and Materials (3). Survey of literature and other materials for children and youth and the criteria for evaluating such materials as they relate to the needs, interests, and capabilities of young readers.

LBSC 650 Information Access (3). Information needs, information interviews, question analysis, information resources, search strategy, query formulation, source selection.

LBSC 670 Information Structure (3). Knowledge analysis and representation; information presentation and assimilation; bibliographic and record control.
