

YOUR LIBRARY CARD

If you live in Clinton, you may obtain a library card at the Circulation Desk, located near the front door. Children may obtain a card in September of their Kindergarten year. Parents or guardians are required to co-sign for their child's card. Your library card entitles you to borrow materials from all public libraries in Connecticut.

HOW LONG CAN I KEEP MATERIALS?

Most of our books, CDs, tapes and magazines circulate for a period of two weeks. These materials may be renewed unless another patron has requested them. You may renew library materials at the circulation desk, or phone us to extend the date. Videocassettes and DVDs are restricted to three days, although some instructional titles may be taken out for fourteen days.

INTERLIBRARY LOAN

If the material you need is not in our collection, we'll do our best to borrow it from another library for you. To use this service, simply fill out a request form here or online, and you'll be called as soon as the material arrives. Once you're finished, return the material to us and we'll send it on to its home library.

RESERVING LIBRARY MATERIALS

If the book, CD, or audio you want is not on the shelf when you call or visit, we can place your name on a reserve list, notify you when it comes available, and hold it for you for five working days.

Why buy when you can borrow?

Your Henry Carter Hull Library card gives you borrowing privileges at all public libraries in Connecticut.

Loan period

Most books, CDs, tapes and magazines circulate for 14 days. These materials may be renewed unless someone else has requested them. You may renew library materials at the circulation desk or by phone.

Most videocassettes and DVDs can be borrowed for 3 days. Some instructional titles may be taken out for 14 days.
